CAN Mission Statement:

Role:

The role of the CAN Action Coordinator is to organize local awareness and grassroots action efforts in their community as needed.

Description:

When the government fails in its role to protect the rights of the people, it is up to the citizens themselves to defend their rights. Battles are won in the trenches and CAN is looking for action-oriented leaders to spearhead and organize efforts on a local level under the guidance of the CAN Director. This can include, but is not limited to: sign-waves, rallies, protests, marches, coordinated meetings with legislators, email blitzes, call blitzes, educational forums, town halls, etc.

Primary Responsibilities:

- 1) Work with the CAN Director to accomplish CAN initiatives in the local arena.
- 2) Serve as the organizer and point person for local grassroots action
- 3) Coordinate at least 4-5 action events per year.
- 4) Develop ongoing, organized dialog and collaboration with local grassroots allies.

Qualifications:

- 1) Previous experience conducting grassroots action is preferred.
- 2) Must be bold, tenacious, and passionate about creating real change and awareness.
- 3) Must be able to clearly communicate the goal of each event to area CAN members.
- 4) Must be able to efficiently organize the critical aspects of each event to avoid participant confusion.

Supervision:

CAN Action Coordinators report to the CAN Director.
