



## **Citizen Action Network Community Group Leader**

### **CAN Mission Statement:**

To connect, equip, and empower citizens to champion their rights and fulfill their duties as people in a free society.

### **Description:**

The role of the Community Group Leader is to provide area CAN members with a venue to connect with each other, receive valuable training, and coordinate local action and activities.

### **Goal:**

CAN Community Groups exist to provide a local rallying point for area CAN members. Intended to be far more than a social or educational scene, these groups also come with the expectation of action. If Americans are going to take back the country that is rightfully theirs from an ever-increasing government, they must be proactive about joining the fight. These meetings should unite local members together, equip them for action, and serve as the staging ground for mobilized efforts.

### **Primary Responsibility:**

- 1) Host a Community Group meeting each month which provides:
  - a) Opportunity for area CAN members to connect with each other on a relational level
  - b) Useful skills training, foundational knowledge, or issue awareness
  - c) One “outreach” action opportunity per quarter (once every 3 meetings)
    - (1) Examples: Visiting a legislator as a group, coordinating a group email campaign to influence an issue, creating an issue-awareness video, etc.

### **Qualifications:**

- 1) Must be a member of the Citizen Action Network for at least 3 months.
- 2) Must possess a positive and inclusive leadership style.
- 3) Must have good people skills and enjoy facilitating networking opportunities.

### **Pre-Requisites:**

- 1) Must complete First Principles of Freedom class
- 2) Must interview (via phone or in-person) with the Executive Leader for the region.

### **Supervision:**

CAN Community Group leaders report directly to the regional Executive Leader. If there is no Executive Leader in the region, CCG leaders will report to the CAN Director.

### **Benefits:**

- 1) Subscription to a select monthly email list, designed specifically for those in a CAN Volunteer position. This email will contain tips, ideas, special materials, news, and other helpful information to help you succeed in your role.
- 2) The ability to make a direct impact in your community. By providing a rallying point and local leadership for CAN members in your area, you are helping to intensify our efforts and multiply the results.
- 3) You will be joining with a recognized and credible organization to protect the freedoms and principles our country was founded upon.

- 4) Admittance to specialized training sessions, access to complimentary copies of curriculum and educational materials; first look privileges for new EFF products; invitation to yearly CAN Retreat.
