THIS MATTER came on regularly for hearing on September 16, 1976, on Plaintiff's motion for a temporary restraining order against Defendants, Plaintiff being represented by Gary M. Little, its attorney, and Defendant Seattle Teachers Association being represented by its attorneys, Frank H. Retman and Harold H. Green of MacDonald, Hoague & Bayless. The court examined the file herein, heard counsel, is fully informed and concludes:

Plaintiff has a legal right to be free from strikes by its employees. The affidavits and briefs submitted establish that the Defendants claim to be employees of the Seattle School District for a great many purposes, and are currently claiming and accepting benefits by reason of this employment. In addition, they are utilizing procedures that are only available to employees of the District.

The District acted on August 27th and September 10th, to determine which employees were available for employment and extended contracts, subject to the final terms as agreed upon in the collective bargaining process. The District has established the necessary record to obtain a temporary restraining order.

In addition to this court's order of September 13, 1976,

1 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

2 That all Defendants hereinbelow defined be, and hereby  
3 are, restrained from <sup>Stalking</sup> stopping work or willfully failing to  
4 report for work or to perform their assigned employment  
5 responsibilities:

6 Any Defendant, and all other persons acting in  
7 active concert or in participation with such  
8 Defendants, claiming to be a certificated employee  
9 of Seattle School District No. 1, for the purposes  
10 of the reemployment rights set forth in RCW 28A.67.070  
11 and tendered a contract or right to reemployment by  
12 the District letters of August 27th and September 10,  
13 1976, and wishing to accept such contract and/or  
14 statutory reemployment rights.

15 This Order shall be effective as follows:

16 ~~1. With respect to all of the above described persons~~  
17 ~~who have accepted and returned to the District the contract~~  
18 ~~tendered by the District on either August 27 or September 10,~~  
19 ~~1976, on the day determined by the Superintendent of the~~  
20 ~~Seattle School District No. 1 for the resumption of normal~~  
21 ~~operations;~~

22 ~~2. With respect to all of the above described persons~~  
23 ~~who have not executed and returned either the August 27 or~~  
24 ~~September 10, 1976 contract tendered by the District: on~~  
25 ~~the day that they do execute and return the contract tendered~~  
26 ~~by the District on September 10 or on the first day of school~~  
27 ~~operation subsequent to September 24, 1976, whichever occurs~~


