Re: May 13, 2004 Public Records Request and your July 2, 2004 Reply

Dear Ms. Pollard:

Your reply omitted several documents which were requested by EFF.

1. Request: *Per Section 3.5 of the state's agreement with Boeing please provide a copy of the state contract with the "qualified, reputable, experienced, independent national recognized consultant firm" that conducted "a comprehensive economic study and analysis of the impacts and benefits of Project Olympus for the State, its citizens and its taxpayers."*

The contract you furnished was between Deloitte & Touche and DCI, dated Feb. 17, 2004. You did not furnish us a copy of the contract with the state. As you are aware, CTED's contract with DCI, requires a written agreement between DCI and CTED prior to subcontracting.

I. Please send a copy of your agreement with DCI on this subcontract. This is not a new public records request; this is a request for a document you failed to provide in regard to our May 13th request.

2. Request: *Per Section 7.3 of the Boeing Agreement, please provide a copy of the required executive order or any other document that would be responsive to this section"*

The document you furnished was signed by the Governor on May 3, 2004, however, Martha Choe's cover memo dated June 10, 2004, indicates that the document had not been signed as she said, "I am asking you to approve the document for your signature and distribution to the cabinet directors named in the memo. This will fulfill this specific provision of the site agreement."

II. Please send the Governors's signed copy of the document Choe referenced. This is not a new public records request; this is a request for a specific document you failed to provide in regard to our May 13th request.

3. Request. *Per Section 10.2 of the Boeing agreement, please provide a copy of all the authorizing governmental resolutions required by this section (referenced as those documents that were to make up the blank Exhibit F).*

Your July 2 letter states, "At this time, we have not received any further authorizing resolutions and therefore do not have any records responsive to this part of your request." Ms. Krier essentially said the same thing in her letter to us. However, the documents you provided indicate you do, in fact, have these documents and you have not provided them to EFF. The documents indicate that you have "authorizing resolutions from the Port (received prior to March 8), Everett (received prior to April 26) and Snohomish County (received prior to March 8) only." In addition you have SnoPud minutes (received prior to April 8) related to his issue.

III. Please send a copy of all authorizing government resolutions. These resolutions are readily identifiable by your office and have been included on your "Master Site Development and Location Agreement for Everett, Washington." This is not a new public records request; this is a request for a specific documents you failed to provide in regard to our May 13th request.

4. Request. *Our 4th request included "a copy of all the AFB's organization documents, including by-laws, as well as a list of the AFB's membership.*

You did not provide us the organizational documents, including the by-laws. You furnished us several versions of the AFB advisory group, but not a list of the actual AFB membership

You provided us duplicate copies of the Boeing 7E7 Dreamliner implementation and planning meeting notes for January 14, 2004, however, you failed to provide the March 3 and May 26 meeting notes.

IV. Please send a copy of the missing meeting notes; all AFB organizational documents, including by-laws, and a list of the AFB membership. This is not a new public records request; this is a request for a specific documents you failed to provide in regard to our May 13th request.

Since these documents are documents that are readily identifiable to your office and since we have been waiting since May 13, 2004, for these documents, we request that you make these available as soon as possible.
