The Marysville teacher union says teachers should make more money. The Marysville School Board says they have no more money to give.

## Who's telling the truth?

Teacher union leaders say Marysville administrators have given themselves large raises. The administration says they have not done this.

## Who's shooting straight here?

The teacher union claims Marysville teachers will lose pay if they accept the district's offer. They say teachers will have to work eight unpaid days. The district says no teacher will lose pay and no unpaid work days are expected.

## What's the right number?

The district says Marysville teachers are the second highest paid in the state. The teacher union says they are 126th in the state.

A representative from the Marysville administration has been invited to join a representative from the Marysville Education Association in a debate to answer these and other issues. Audience questions will follow. This is a Town Hall meeting, not a rally for one side or the other. The sponsors (who do have opinions on this matter), will go to great lengths to maintain fairness, order and civil discourse.
